Phonics



Writing

Our writing will be linked closely to the books that we read as well as incidental writing in continuous provision. We will continue to work on developing our independent writing to write sentences that include a capital letter at the beginning, finger spaces between words and a full stop at the end. We will focus on spelling words by using the sounds we know to sound them out as well as remembering and learning to and include some 'red' tricky words in our writing. Our handwriting will continue to be a focus where we will work on forming lowercase letters correctly, starting and finishing in the right place. We will also look at the size of our letters relative to one another.



Science

All about me: Identify, name and label the basic parts of the human body Using our senses to explore different textures, sounds and smells.

Exploring how we grow, our needs for survival and how we stay healthy and hygienic.

Observing the changes across Summer, Autumn and Winter, recording weather and comparing day length. Identify and name deciduous and evergreen trees.
