Curriculum

In our South America topic this term we have covered the following and will be continuing with some of this after SATS:

Writing: The children have written a range of texts linked to our topic:

Created a guidebook on how to survive in the Amazon

Maya Folktale

Biographies of famous South Americans

An explanation text of how chocolate in made from the bean to the bar.

DT: With Miss Daly, Class 4 enjoyed learning about the Rio de Janeiro Carnival and designing and making carnival masks. They thought about their design carefully and the aesthetic and functional characteristics that their mask would need before carefully making them and then evaluating the process. **Geography:** Children developed a deep understanding of Fair Trade with a particular focus on Fair Trade production of chocolate in South America. We really enjoyed inviting parents into school for our *Fair Trade Fortnight* assembly too!

History: After February half term, we began our topic on the ancient Maya. The children have a sense of how this period relates to previous periods studied in history, they know the key Maya city states and the typical features of these cities. On number day, they particularly enjoyed learning about this civilisation's ancient number system! We still have so much to learn about this exciting period in ancient history!





Science: In science, children have been studying evolution and inheritance. They particularly enjoyed learning more about the theories of Charles Darwin and carrying out an investigation into how birds' beaks have adapted according to their diet.





Shakespeare: The children began to explore Macbeth during *Shakespeare Week* and we hope to continue with this after the Easter break. The week began with the children discovering a crime scene in the classroom (King Duncan's death) which really peaked their interest. We then moved onto drama-based activities looking in particular at the three witches and their prophecies.
