Spring Term Curriculum Review - Reception



Although the Spring term is shorter, it is by no means less busy! The Reception children have been busy bees this term and are becoming much more independent in their learning and play. It is wonderful to see them accessing areas of our provision purposefully and seeking challenge in their own play too.



To welcome us back after Christmas, we absolutely loved reading and sharing the book 'The Invisible String'. This allowed us to really think about our connections with people and places and we talked about why and how we feel connected to others. We talked about things that connect us too, such as 'children who have a sibling', 'children who have a pet', and 'children in green house team'



Our literacy learning and early reading is progressing well and it is wonderful to see the children choosing to read books freely. They are now all blending and we are now progressing onto using our phonics learning to help us write simple sentences. Your child will now be bringing home a

phonics reading book that is suitably matched to their phonics progress and it is so important that your look at these books little and often to embed learning from school.

We have noticed a real shift in the children's' enthusiasm too for independent writing and through lots of encouragement and praise, our little ones are choosing to write and mark making in lots of areas of the provision. From labelling their models, copying from books in the reading area and writing their own stories, we are thrilled to see so much writing taking place!

We thoroughly enjoyed celebrating all things number for our Number Day in school! There were some very creative costumes and we had a day of all things number. playdough, we compared length, creating some very, very long snakes!












We have been learning all about doubling this week in maths. Hannah and Hettie decided to create their own doubling story!







Library also visited our class and shared a lovely story with us and all of the children were


It was lovely to welcome parents into school for our 'Show the Love' assembly in February. The children worked














